SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. RULES

The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.

2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board(s) located at the shed and Race Office end room

3. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 hours on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 hours on the day before it will take effect.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

Signals made ashore will be displayed at the flag poles near shed
When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than minutes' in the race signal AP

5. SCHEDULE OF RACES

28th August – 0900 to 1700 hours – Race office open
29th August – 0930 to 1130 hours - Registration in Race Office
29th August – 1300 hours, first of 2 races back to back (to be confirmed for CVRDA)
30th August – 1030 hours – One race only
30th August – 1330 hours – first of 2 races back to back
31st August – 1030 hours - first of 2 races back to back
31st August – 1430 hours, approximately, Prize Giving

No warning signal will be made after 1300 hours on the last day of racing.

6. CLASS FLAGS

Class flags will be: *Flag 'R'* for Goodacre Cup
CVRDA flag for CVRDA fleet

7. RACING AREAS

The Race area will be Roadford Lake. Prohibited areas will be treated as obstructions.

8. MARKS

Marks 1,2,3 and 4 will be the large Red Conical (Strawberries)

The starting and finishing marks will be orange marker buoy with a blue flag

9. THE START

Races will be started by using rule 26

The first start will be Goodacre cup fleet followed by the CVRDA

10. CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will move the original mark (or the finishing line) to a new position.

11. THE FINISH

The finishing line will be between the committee boat and the orange buoy with a blue flag

12. TIME LIMITS

Boats failing to finish within *60 minutes* after the first boat sails the course and finishes will be scored Did Not Finish. This changes rules 35 and A4

Average lap times will be taken for slower CVRDA boats.

13. PROTESTS

Protests shall be written on forms available at the race office and delivered there within Protest Time which will begin as the last boat nears the dinghy park and ends 60 minutes later.

Protests will be heard in approximately the order of receipt beginning at the time displayed on the official notice board.

Protest noticed will be posted within 60 minutes of the protest time limit to inform competitors where and when there is a hearing in which they are parties to hearing or named as witnesses.

The decision of the Protest Committee will be final as provided in rule 70.4

14. SAFETY REGULATIONS

Check out and check in:

A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.

15. REPLACEMENT OF CREW OR EQUIPMENT

Substitution of competitors will not be allowed without prior written approval of the (race committee)

Substitution of damaged or lost equipment will not be allowed unless approved by the race committee. Requests for substitution shall be made to the committee at the first reasonable opportunity

16. EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the class rules and sailing instructions. On the water, a boat can be instructed by a race committee measurer to proceed immediately to a designated area for inspection.

17. SUPPORT BOATS

Team leaders, coaches and other support personnel shall stay outside areas where boats are racing from the time of the preparatory signal for the first class to start until all boats have finished or the race committee signals a postponement, general recall or abandonment, apart from with the permission of the Race Officer for Cadet Training.

18. RADION COMMUNICATION

A boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

19. PRIZES

Prizes will be decided on the weekend depending on the amount of entrants

20. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage of personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

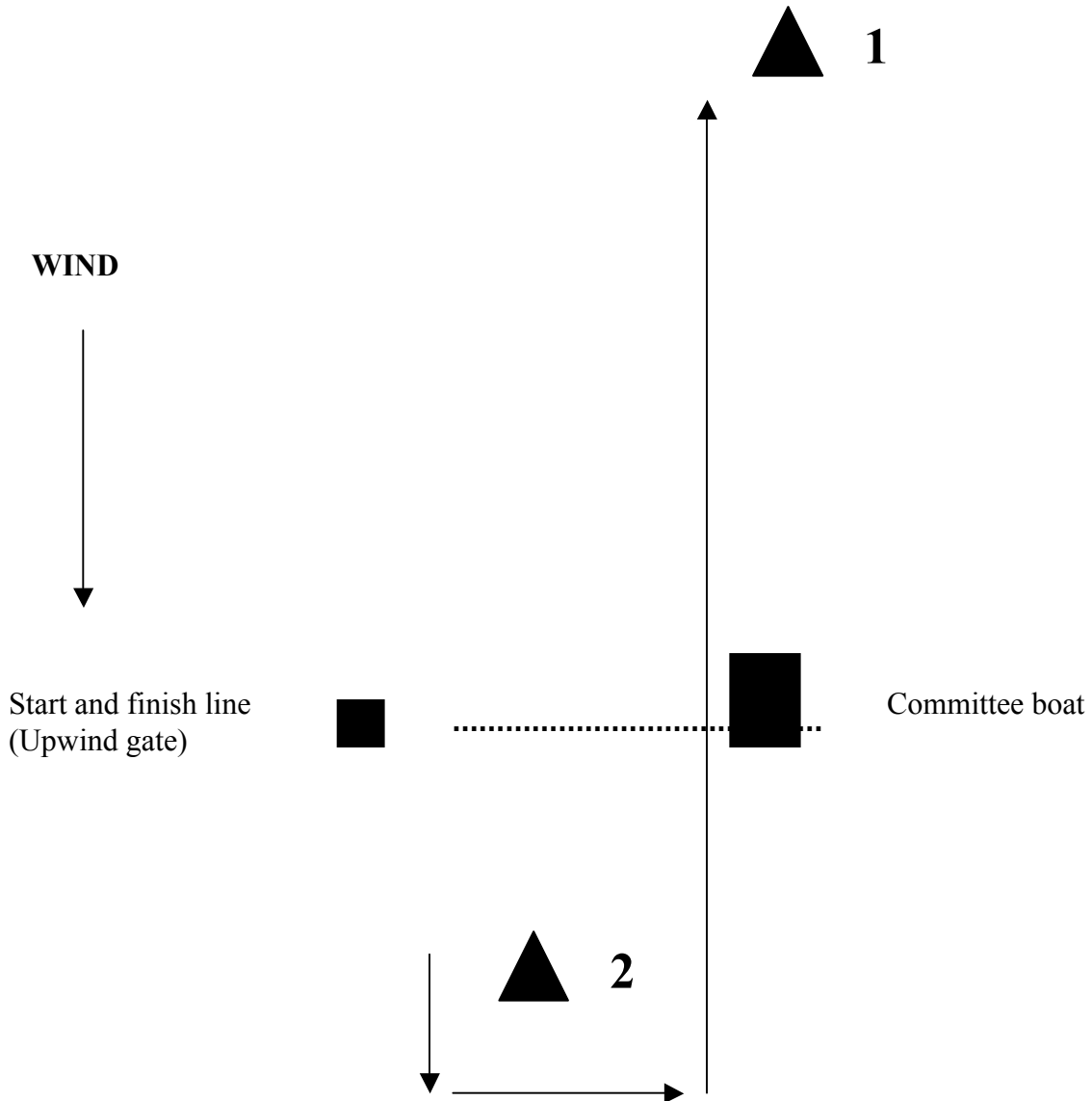
21. INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of 2 million per event or the equivalent.

ADDENDUM A

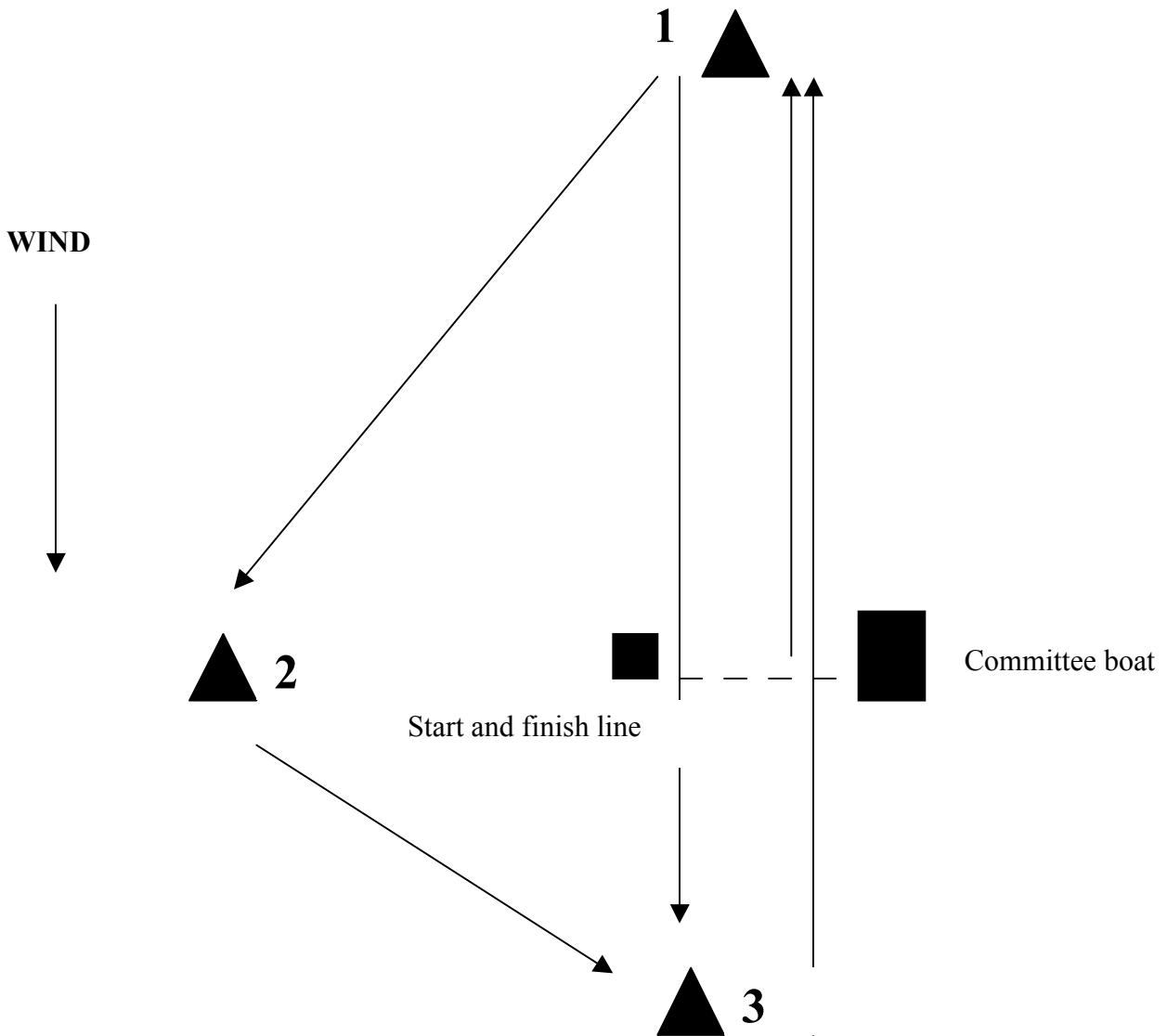
**A Windward-Leeward Course
